How's Biz? A note from your Executive Director,
Michael Wells



I can't say that I knew Brian Fairbrother or Tyrone Fabroa well because I didn't. I can tell you that I remember them both smiling whenever I ran into them on Broadway. I ran into the two of them quite often - Broadway being my home turf - and we'd always smile or nod, the kind of smile and nod that you do with neighbors as you're on your way to catch the bus, run to the post office, grab your morning coffee.

Brian was the general manager of Espresso Vivace and Tyrone the manager of the Pagliacci Pizza on Broadway. They were my co-workers, as much as the people who work in office buildings downtown and pass by each other every day are co-workers. We all worked on Broadway and we instinctually knew the rhythms of each other's work days, the customers, the dogs, the children and the good times and bad on the street. We shared a place in the world, a very special place, and a quick 'hello' was all that was really needed way to acknowledge each other's presence, wish each other a good day, to pass on some goodwill.

Tyrone Fabroa died on August 1 in a water related accident. Brian Fairbrother died on September 8th of injuries related to a bicycling accident. It's hard to write those words about people I knew casually, as there is nothing casual about someone's death. The pain that I see in the eyes of the folks at Pagliacci and Vivace is fresh as they go about their work day missing one of their own. Both Tyrone and Brian were deeply cared for by the people in their respective shops. Both interacted with thousands of Seattle customers. Both helped define Broadway as the living organism that it is. Both will be sorely missed.

A family is made up not just of the people who share your biology but of the people who share your daily mundane tasks, your half-waking moments in the world, your connection to a place. Tyrone and Brian were a part of my Broadway family. This hill of ours is a very special place, filled with very special people. I'd ask you to remember that as you go about your work day. Take a moment to look around and see the people that you pass every day. Say 'hello'. Smile.

Saving Puget Sound

Did you know every year thousands of gallons of oil and other contaminants flow into Puget Sound from leaks, spills, improperly stored oil and poor auto maintenance. Poorly maintained automobiles cost you money and do great harm to the environment. Seattle Public Utilities, South Seattle Community College, and Washington State Department of Ecology are providing free automotive workshops to help you save money and protect Puget Sound. The workshop will teach you where most auto leaks occur and how to do simple fixes or mitigate the effects of oil spills and leakage. Each attendee will receive a personal vehicle inspection and a spill cleanup kit. The four-hour workshops are held at South Seattle Community College from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm, on the following Saturdays:
